children live in poverty in Greenwich. The poverty rate among children (42%) is higher than the English average (30%).



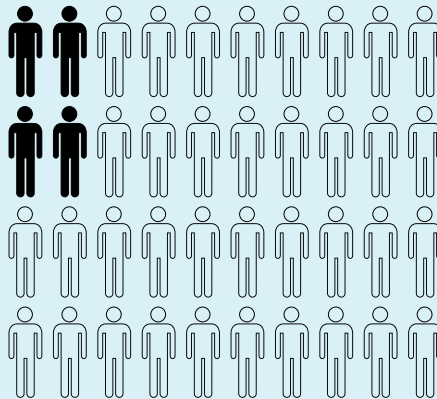
## Skills & Education

16% of 20-24 year olds in London are **not in Education, Employment or Training**

8% of working age people in Greenwich have no or low qualifications (Level 1)

## Unemployment & Wages

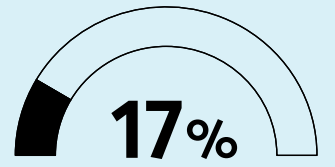
The unemployment rate in London is higher than the English average (5.0% vs 4.1%), while at least **10% of the people** who are in work in Greenwich **earn less than the real Living Wage for London**



## Cost of Living

The cost of living has been increasing across the UK, with inflation at its highest for decades, affecting the affordability of goods and services. **Inflation has been higher in London** than the national average.

Even before the rise in energy costs this year, 17% of households in Greenwich were in **fuel poverty**, compared to 13% of households across England.



Households in Fuel Poverty Greenwich

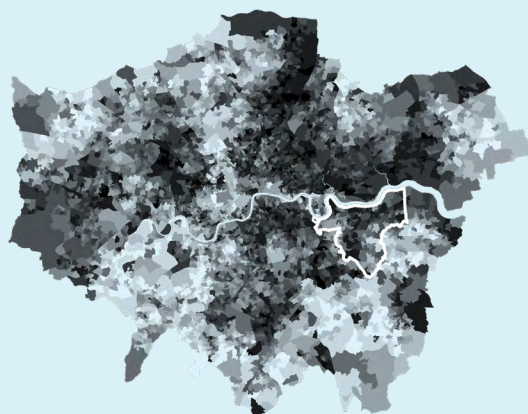
## Areas of Deprivation

77% of areas in Greenwich are among the most deprived 50% of areas in England. In Greenwich, as across London, pockets of affluence exist alongside pockets of deprivation.
